The feedback from our funding agencies has so far been consistently positive, which also strengthens our resolve.

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## SOCIETY

The Association for Sustainable Community Enacted Development e.V. (ASCEND) is a non-profit organization dedicated to helping disadvantaged people worldwide by improving their environmental and sanitary conditions. Here we are concerned not only with the immediate improvement of living conditions, but also with long-term concepts to strengthen communities. The essence of our work is addressing vulnerable areas, which in many cases are areas from which our team members originated. So our main focus is currently on Bangladesh, where four of our team members grew up.

In recent months, our previous projects have entered next phases and received funding and support. You were part of the whole and we want to thank you! ### WATER4DACOPE

Location	Dacope Upazilla, Bangladesh
Duration	12 months (01-12/2018)
Beneficiaries	about 3,900 people
Partner	RUPANTAR, Bangladesh



Our pioneering project, which reflects the basic idea of our approach: The brainchild of one of our members, who comes from the affected region and understands both the needs and the opportunities within the region. The partnership between ASCEND and RUPANTAR, which developed a project to secure a clean drinking water supply in Dacope, Bangladesh, against the background of both aspects. The result: Our four projects from Water4Dacope.

We discussed in our last newsletter the "hows" and "whys" and more specific details about the steps we took. We also talked about our first successes with the first project, the final report of which you can now find on our homepage and download to read the project in detail.

Now to the current state of the project and what has happened in the last five months:

#### PROJECT 2: Repair of two sand filters and reinstallation of a sand filter.

The second project under our Water4Dacope program started on schedule on May 1st of this year. The focus was on the repair of two municipal pond sand filters in the villages of Saheberabad and Podderganj in Dacope, as well as the installation of another filter in the village of West Bajua. Originally, the project was scheduled for July 31st, but due to heavy rains in June construction could not be completed until the end of August.

In order to guarantee the success of the project in the long term, as in the first project, local personnel were trained for each installation, which should eliminate minor failures in the future, so that permanent damage to the system can be prevented. In addition, a Water Management Committee has been set up to take responsibility for the site, organize regular maintenance and manage future oversight.

After commissioning and confirming the drinking water quality by means of water quality tests, the filter in Saheberabad now supplies approximately 350 people with drinking water every day. In addition, the repaired filter in Podderganj ensures a clean drinking water supply for another 330 people, while the newly built filter in West Bajua serves 400 people.

We are therefore very proud to report that with our second project, together with our partner organization RUPANTAR, we helped more than 1,000 people gain access to clean drinking water.

The total budget for the second project was €6,084. We were supported by the ALTERNAID Foundation with a grant of €5,100. The additional funds of €1,000 were generated through external donations.

### PROJECT 3 - Repair of three sand filters

Currently we are working on the third project as part of the ASCEND program Water4Dacope. The work started on September 15th, with a slight delay due to heavy rains and the associated limited access to the project area for our team.

In this project, we also want to repair three sand filters in the villages of Chitabunia, East Bajua and Kamarkhola, of course, with simultaneous training of a local maintenance staff and the formation of Water Management Committees to ensure long-term operation and stable funding.

The third project is funded by the Tools for Life Foundation, which supports this project with €3,941. The own contribution of ASCEND, supported by private donations, is €500.

## MENSTRUAL HYGIENE INITIATIVE

Location           Dacope Upazilla, Khulna Distrikt, Bangladesh  
Duration           6 months  
Beneficiaries       3,800 women and girls  
Partner             RUPSA, Bangladesh



After the completion of the first MHI project in May, our initiative to de-stigmatize menstrual hygiene and educate women about menstruation in Bangladesh has become somewhat quiet in recent months. However, that does not mean that nothing is happening – behind the scenes, our project team has worked diligently to prepare the next phase of the project, which is finally beginning:

With an expected start at the beginning of 2019, ASCEND, together with our partner organization RUPSA, is planning a further round of educational training in ten other villages in the region and, in particular, the establishment of small village shops, which will be able to produce the sanitary products independently in the long term. Thus, access to these same products as well as other job opportunities are ensured especially for women both in the production in Kakra Bunia and in the sale of the bandages in the individual villages. In addition, three health camps will be established in the villages of Kakra Bunia, Chunkuri and West Banishanta for the treatment of menstruation-related complications.

The project costs will amount to approximately €15,000 and we are currently looking for funding and supporters. Are you enthusiastic about the idea and want to support us financially? ## PROMOTIONS

In addition to all the private donations, company donations and other funds which have reached us in recent months, we are also supported by larger foundations. Listed below is the major grant received in the last five months:

### TOOLS FOR LIFE FOUNDATION – Water4Dacope



Following the success of the first two projects, the Tools For Life Foundation is funding the third round of the Water4Dacope project, which has just begun. This includes the repair of three sand filters in the villages of Chitabunia, East Bajua and Kamarkhola, as well as the maintenance and management trainings. This will give 920 people access to clean drinking water. The project phase runs from Sept. 15th until November 14th, 2018. Tools For Life supports us with a grant of €3,941, so we will add the missing €500 from private donations to ASCEND to the grand total.
